- 1. The Greeks!** Greece is often portrayed as a victim of the economic crisis. Though a crisis offers also opportunities to initiatives that experiment with new forms of living together. Is Greece the social laboratory for new forms of civic engagement? What can we learn from the Greeks?
- 2. Transparency!** How do transparency and accountability movements inspire to move beyond traditional pitfalls and create new opportunities? How can they strengthen civil society without creating new forms of exclusion?
- 3. The Elders!** An ageing population is merely framed as an expensive health care problem. But this group in our society has seen many crisis and holds unknown wisdom. What can we learn from crowd-sourcing the wise Elders?
